







THE COMPETENCE NEXUS AND THE ALBATROSS OF YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

Why technical skills alone are no longer enough for Agbaja youths or any youths in the 21st century.

Here is the problem and the two words that explain it.

For decades, governments, institutions, and well-meaning individuals have poured resources into “youth and women empowerment.” Yet the results remain abysmal: millions of educated young men and women roam the streets without meaningful work, their certificates gathering dust while their potential withers. The very programs designed to liberate them often become an albatross—a heavy yoke of promises that rarely translate into real opportunities or elevated status. Why is this so? The answer lies in two simple but uncanny words: **nexus and albatross.**

A nexus is a meeting point—a place where different parts come together to produce the result we all seek. In youth development, that meeting point is competence: the fusion of technical competence (what you can do) and personal competence (how you think, behave, and execute tasks) working together to create value and strengths. Without this fusion, technical knowledge often becomes dormant, and personal strengths become directionless.

An albatross, by contrast, is a burden—a weight that drags down progress. In youth empowerment, the albatross is the endless cycle of trainings, certificates, and interventions that seldom produce real transformation or sustainable livelihoods.

This article explores how building the nexus of competence can lift the albatross of youth empowerment, transforming a heavy burden into a bridge to prosperity and a life of service, success, and significance—especially in Agbaja and across Enugu state.

A Crisis Hiding in Plain Sight

Most youth empowerment programs rest on an outdated assumption inherited from the Industrial Revolution: “Give them skills and they are made for life.”

It sounds noble and often wins applause. But hidden within this promise is a dangerous half-truth, one that has been brutally exposed by the rise of artificial intelligence. Today, a growing list of AI tools can articulate ideas, generate solutions, and perform technical tasks faster, cheaper, and with fewer errors than most skilled workers. What these systems lack, however, are uniquely human capabilities such as creative imagination, ingenuity, emotional intelligence, critical thinking, and the executive functions that enable people to initiate tasks, sense trends, adapt to situations, seize opportunities, and respond to challenges. These human competencies often dismissed as “soft skills,” are now the most valuable differentiators in modern workplaces and entrepreneurial ecosystems.

Consider the Evidence

Over the past 50 years, Nigeria has received extensive foreign aids - running into tens of billions of dollars - aimed at supporting private sector development and entrepreneurship. In addition, more than 50 government-led intervention programs have been launched to reduce poverty and empower youths, women, and farmers. Yet Nigeria remains one of the global epicenters of multidimensional poverty and socioeconomic inequality. Meanwhile, undocumented migrants from neighboring countries, often possessing both technical and interpersonal capabilities, continue to secure jobs that many locals leave untapped. This uncomfortable truth leads to an inevitable conclusion: Our problem is no longer skills as we once understood them. It is competence.

In today’s context, competence is the integrated capacity to apply technical knowledge, personal skills, and AI-augmented abilities to create value in real, dynamic environments. Globalization and digital disruption have fundamentally changed how value is produced; therefore competence now rests on a tripod:

1. Technical skills
2. Personal (life and soft) skills
3. AI-enabled collaboration



Beyond the Parable: Fishing and the Future of Work

We all know the proverb: “Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day. Teach him to fish and you set him up for life.” This proverb remains true—but only if “teaching to fish” covers both sides of competence:

1. Technical Competence (Hard Skills) – The What. Casting the net, fixing it, sensing and knowing where the fish are. This competence accounts for only about **20%** of entrepreneurial success.



2. Personal Competence (Soft Skills) – The Who. Rising early in the morning, enduring inclement weather conditions, adapting when fish migrate, persuading buyers, and staying consistent. This makes up **80%** of long-term success.

Without both, “teaching to fish” merely produces a generation of trained but stranded youths —gifted but scattered, knowledgeable but unable to convert that knowledge into value or performance.



Beyond the technical definitions It is worthy of note to understand that competence spans three core dimensions of human behavior and human functions:

- 1. Cognitive (Thinking)** – how you plan, reason, and conceptualize.
- 2. Affective (Feeling)** – the emotions, attitudes, and mindsets you bring.
- 3. Conative (Acting)** – how you perform under real-world challenges.

Thus, competence is measured by the demonstrable evidence that you can apply your knowledge, skills, and resources effectively in any situation including when you are under pressure.

Why Most Youth Empowerment Programs Fail

In addition to everything we have discussed, especially the chronic failure to integrate the two sides of competence, the technical and the personal, and now the rising hysteria about AI—a sober review of decades of interventions reveals a familiar, dysfunctional pattern: programs heavy on theory but light on systems, abundant in workshops but empty of follow-through, rich in certificates yet poor in competence. We keep repeating the same cycle, expecting different results - an odd habit Albert Einstein famously described as a form of insanity.

A Way Forward

To thrive in the 21st century, Agbaja youths and all Nigerian youths must become proficient in navigating life using a Competence Compass built on four pillars:

- 1. Technical Mastery (Hard Skills):** Knowing what to do.
- 2. Personal Mastery (Soft Skills):** Knowing who you are and mastering the critical life and soft skills that help you initiate and complete tasks such as impulse control, planning and prioritizing, adaptability, emotional intelligence, critical thinking, decision-making, and effective communication.
- 3. Capability (Potential):** Access to resources, frameworks, systems, mentorship, and technology, especially AI.
- 4. Competency (Performance):** Evidence of results—measurable outputs, portfolios, and achievements.

Across Agbaja and across Nigeria, we live with a painful paradox: we have an abundance of talented young people, yet we still cling to outdated empowerment models built on obsolete theories. These programs stop at technical training and ignore the operating systems of success—the life skills, soft skills, and AI-driven capabilities that account for over 80% of real-world performance. In today's borderless, fast-shifting economy, hard skills may open the first door of opportunities, but it is personality-driven competence that determines whether you can enter, remain, and rise.

As we gather for the Agbaja Education and Entrepreneurial Summit 2025, one truth must guide our deliberations: empowerment without structure, and without the fusion of technical mastery, personal mastery, and intelligent collaboration with AI, will simply recycle past failures. If we want sustainable progress, we must build competence systems that ensure:

- Replicable business and organizational models
- Apprenticeship, internship pipelines, and mentorship ladders
- Market linkages and global exposure
- Consistent modeling of global best practices

This is the only reliable path to authentic and sustainable youth empowerment. Therefore, let the minimum legacy of this Summit be that no participant, youth or leader, should leave the Amadeo Event Center without grasping the existential truths articulated here. In a world overflowing with certificates and technical skills, your real value and your real currency, is competence: *the fusion of what you know, who you are, and how consistently you deliver results.*


Professor Chinedu O. Nebo, OFR


Prince Victor Ogakwu




His Excellency, Chief C. C. Onoh (Aninefungwu)




